Builth Wells Primary School has a maximum of fourteen governors. Three are appointed by the County Council and one by the Town Council. Four parent governors are elected by ballot and one teacher and one other staff governor are elected by the school staff. In addition, we co-opt three members from the local community. All governors serve for four years, then they must be re-appointed or re-elected. The next opportunity for an election for a parent governor will be in October 2022.

The Headteacher is also a governor, and the Deputy Headteacher also attends meetings as an observer. Parents have access to minutes of governors' meetings and all school policy documents.

Curriculum / Cwricwlwm

In 2021-22, teachers in all classes followed ERW Schemes of Work to deliver Language and Mathematics. These were taught as discrete subjects in whole class lessons or focused group tasks. All other subjects / areas of learning were taught through a series of linked subjects under a broader topic theme. Pupils had timetabled P.E. sessions each week as well as additional health and wellbeing activities. Year 5 and 6 returned to swimming lessons in the summer term.

It is sometimes necessary to adapt the curriculum and/or timetable for pupils with additional needs. This may take the form of a simplified timetable or programme of work.

Pupils in the Welsh Stream are immersed in the Welsh language on entry to the school and are taught is as a first language. English is introduced as a subject in Year 3. We are proud that we have achieved the Siarter laith silver award for our provision of a language-rich and culturally stimulating environment. Pupils in the English Stream learn Welsh as a second language, and we have also achieved the Cymraeg Campus Bronze Award for introducing the language to many aspects of school life.

Monitoring Standards

Governors assisted school leaders in the monitoring of reading, maths and digital competence. Areas of strength were identified as well as areas for further improvement which have been fed into the school development plan.

HEALTHY EATING/DRINKING- BWYTA AC YFED YN IACH

Our school promotes healthy eating. Children are only permitted to eat fruit/vegetables at break time. Children are encouraged to bring water bottles into class to keep them hydrated and are only permitted to drink juice or squash at mealtimes. The responsibility for the provision of a paid for school meals service, free school meals for eligible children and deciding the form of school meals lies with Powys Catering Services. Parents are encouraged to provide their children with a nutritious, balanced packed lunch if they do not purchase a school lunch.
